
# New Era

## **Beware of scammers**

## What should I do if I get a scam call?

Older people are often a target for scammers, so it's important to be aware of phone scams and how to handle them. Fortunately, there are things you can do to protect yourself:


- **Don't reveal personal details.** Never give out personal or financial information (such as your bank account details or your PIN) over the phone, even if the caller claims to be from your bank.
- **Hang up.** If you feel harassed or intimidated, or if the caller talks over you without giving you a chance to speak, end the call. It may feel rude to hang up on someone, but you have the right not to be pressurised into anything.
- Ring the organisation. If you're unsure whether the caller is genuine, you can always ring the company or bank they claim to be from. Make sure you find the number yourself and don't use the one provided by the caller.
- **Don't be rushed.** Scammers will try to rush you into providing your personal details. They may say they have time-limited offer or claim your bank account is at risk if you don't give them the information they need right away.

## What should I do next?

Register your landline and your mobile phone with the Telephone Preference Service (TPS). To register your mobile phone, text 'TPS' and your email address to 85095.

• Talk to your phone provider to see what privacy services and call-blocking services are available, although you may need to pay for some of these services.

Rainham Marshes is a nature reserve maintained by the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds (RSPB). Its medieval marshes are both an important area for wildlife and a great place for visitors.

Birds can be seen all year round. In spring and summer you can expect to see breeding wading birds and in winter large flocks of wild ducks visit the reserve. You may see water voles and dragonflies too.

Boardwalks throughout the reserve allow access for wheelchairs and pushchairs and the visitor centre has picture windows with views across the marshes.

The marshes were opened in 2000 after being closed to the public for more than 100 years. The site was previously used as a military firing range.

There are many events throughout the year for families.

## Visiting the marshes and reserve

Rainham Marshes Nature Reserve is open 9:30am to 4:30pm from 1 November to 31 March and 9:30am to 5pm from 1 April to 31 October. It is closed on Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

#### Features include:

- a car park, voluntary £1 donation
- free entry to site for RSPB members and residents of Thurrock and Havering
- nature trails
- a pushchair friendly site
- picnic areas
- adventure playground
- toddlers playground

All the reserve's paths and boardwalks are family and wheelchair friendly.

No dogs are allowed in the reserve except registered assistance dogs. Dogs are allowed on the Thames riverside path, however – a public footpath and cycleway running adjacent to the reserve.
